Dear Member of Congress:

This book provides you a snapshot of adult education in your state. You will be shocked by the need but pleased with the contributions your adult education professionals are making with limited funds.

Daily, adult education and family literacy teachers interview new prospective students, help them clarify their education goals, assess their current skill level in relation to that goal, help them design a learning plan to obtain those skills and reach that goal, determine if learning disabilities will require customized learning strategies, and get them started. They monitor and support the student's progress through the learning plan with regular periodic reviews with the student to determine if the learning resources are working and if progress is being made toward the goal. Together they adapt the learning plan accordingly.

Customizing a learning plan toward a specific goal and organizing the reading, math, English, problem solving, and listening resources in a progression from current skill levels to goal levels is no easy chore. Helping students deal with the negative factors that may interfere with their participation is no small task. Helping them believe they can succeed when they were not successful in school before is a challenge.

Fundamental Facts of Adult Education

Background

The adult education program was first authorized in the 1960s as part of the Economic Opportunity Act, passed into law on August 20, 1964. That law created a federal/state partnership to focus on improving the academic skills of adults who had not completed a secondary education or whose ability to read, write and compute impaired their ability to obtain or retain employment.

Although the law has been modified many times to expand its focus, improve practice and create a National Institute for Literacy to provide a resource for the adult education field, the basic purpose of helping individuals improve their academic skills is still the major program goal.

As part of the most recent reauthorization, the program was renamed the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act and became Title II of the Workforce Investment Act. The new law completed the evolution to performance measures and continuous improvement, encouraged the use of curriculum based on scientific research where available, and linked services to work-related partners. At the same time it reduced funds available for states to carry out professional development.

The population served

Adult education programs serve approximately 3 million individuals a year combining federal, state and local funds. Eligible participants include adults whose English, reading and/or math skills are below the high school completion level. Approximately half have a learning disability—average or above intelligence, but they learn differently. Learning differently helps explain why many did not complete high school or gain the skills they needed.

Adults come to adult education programs for a variety of reasons. Approximately half are limited English proficient. Others come to obtain a GED or high school diploma or to improve their literacy and other academic skills in order to obtain or retain a job or assist their children with their school work. Many participants are interested in improving their skills so they can leave the welfare rolls or transition to a postsecondary institution or participate in a job training program.

According to the most recent National Assessment of Adult Literacy conducted by Institute of Education Sciences, Department of Education, approximately 93 million individuals could benefit from participation in adult education services. Of those 93 million, 30 million are at the lowest level of literacy, below basic. Adults at this level range from those who are unable to read and understand any written information in English to those who have a difficult time reading.

Service providers

A number of organizations and agencies provide quality adult education and family literacy services in communities across the country. The law encourages a variety of providers by requiring states to provide “direct and equitable” access to funds to all eligible providers that include, among others, local educational agencies, community and faith-based organizations of demonstrated effectiveness, volunteer literacy organizations of demonstrated effectiveness, institutions of higher education, public or private nonprofit agencies, libraries, and public housing authorities.

Approximately 80 percent of adult education professionals are part-time. Few are trained in the unique adult education skill set prior to teaching adults. The diversity of professionals attracted to adult education brings richness to the field. However, due to the unique skills required to help adults learn, a strong pre-service and professional development system is necessary.

Participant goals

Each adult student comes to adult education for a reason. That personal goal becomes the basis for developing an individual study plan. Reading, math and English are provided in the context—work, family, community—that reflects each learner’s goal. While learning English and obtaining a GED or high school diploma are often program goals, they are but a few of the reasons adults participate in programs.

Program performance

From the federal level, adult education is guided by performance measures—improving reading, math, English; transition to post secondary education or other training programs; and attaining or maintaining a job. Each state negotiates levels of performance on each measure. Usually, each state in turn negotiates performance levels with each local provider.

Almost all the states exceed their performance standards. The Office of Management and Budget rates federal programs using the Performance Assessment Rating Tool (PART). The most recent PART evaluation provided adult education program with an “effective” rating, one of only four Department of Education programs to achieve such a rating. This is the highest rating given by OMB.
